Charles Martin “Touch a Life” Scholarship

DEADLINE: THURSDAY, MARCH 1, 2012

This renewable scholarship was established to create a meaningful and lasting tribute to one of our community’s most effective mentors by helping local, academically motivated African-American students attend college with a \$2,500 annual scholarship.

Students must:

- Be of African American descent
- Be a resident of St. Joseph County, Indiana
- Graduate from an accredited Indiana high school by June of the year of application
- Possess a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 and be in good academic standing
- Demonstrate financial need

Jon and Sonja Laidig Community Service Scholarship

DEADLINE: THURSDAY, MARCH 1, 2012

This renewable scholarship promotes service in the nonprofit sector in two ways: It provides students with a \$2,500 stipend to support them in a summer internship with a community nonprofit organization and a \$5,000 yearly scholarship.

Students must:

- Be a resident of St. Joseph County, Indiana
- Graduate from an accredited Indiana high school by June of the year of application
- Not be eligible to receive a full tuition benefit from the student’s school of choice

Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship Program

DEADLINE: FRIDAY, JANUARY 6, 2012

Students must:

- Be a resident of St. Joseph County, Indiana
- Graduate from an accredited Indiana high school by June of the year of application
- Intend to pursue a full-time baccalaureate course of study at an accredited public or private Indiana college or university
- Possess a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.8 OR an SAT score of 1800 out of 2400 (or ACT equivalent if SAT was not taken) at the conclusion of the sixth semester. SAT scores are comprised of the highest math, verbal, and written portions of the exam
