Commitment 10: We will collectively build a Shared Vision for Best Practice Instruction in our classrooms (What We Will



## New Prairie Names New Head Basketball Coach

New Prairie High School has named a new head basketball coach who is ready to roll up his sleeves and stick with the program for the long haul. Michael Bauer, who most recently

taught and coached at St. Joseph High School in South Bend, was chosen from a pool of more than 20 applicants for the position. Bauer became known at the school for being an engaging classroom teacher and a successful basketball coach.

Bauer will also serve as a social studies teacher at New Prairie High School. He was approved for the position by the New Prairie United School Corp. School Board of Trustees at its June 17 meeting.

"Coach Bauer is known for being a straightforward coach that values honesty, defining roles for players, calm and

consistency under pressure and finally that players represent the program in a positive way at all times," Athletic Director Ben Bachmann said. "He hopes to implement an uptempo style of play that places emphasis on disruption defensively."

At St. Joseph High School, Bauer amassed a 77-44 win/loss record, winning two sectional championships and two Northern Indiana Conference Division Titles.

"I am honored to become a part of the New Prairie family and get to work installing our system," he said. "We are excited about the players in the program and look forward to getting started."

## Baseball Coach Mark Schellinger Celebrates 100 Career Wins During Big New Prairie Season

When New Prairie United School Corp. staff attended a South Bend Cubs game together to celebrate the end of the school year in June, it was only appropriate that Mark Schellinger hoisted the "W" flag to celebrate the Cubs' win over the Bowling Green Hot Rods. If high schools shared the same habit of flying a "W" flag after each win, it would have been raised more than 100 times in honor of Schellinger. In the IHSBCA North-South All-Star Series, Schellinger served as the head coach of the North squad.

Schellinger, a 2002 graduate of LaPorte High School, celebrated his 100th career coaching win in April during an impressive season that caused the South Bend Tribune to call New Prairie's baseball team "one of the best kept secrets in Northern Indiana." Schellinger spent nine seasons coaching at Merrillville before coming to New Prairie High School.

Schellinger was named the Northern Indiana Conference Coach of the Year in 2019.

## **Back-to-School Registration Information**

A registration event for all grades (kindergarten through 12th grade) will take place from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. CST on Tuesday, July 30, inside the New Prairie Middle School gymnasium.

Parents or guardians may complete ALL paperwork (textbook fees, free- and reduced-price lunch applications, emergency information, optional iPad insurance) through the Power School Registration website at any time. After Aug. 5, parents can visit their child's school to access school computers to register.

Families without internet access at home can use computers at the registration event to complete the necessary forms. iCoaches will be available to assist in any way.

#### K-5th Registration Details:

Families only need to attend the registration event if they wish to pay textbook fees by check or cash, or to obtain a payment plan for the iPad insurance or textbook fees. Children will not be receiving their iPads during the registration event and will instead receive their device at the start of the school year with their classroom teacher.

#### 6th-12th Registration Details:

iPads will be available for pickup at the registration event. Families who complete paperwork online ahead of the event will have a very short wait time for iPad pickup. New Prairie strongly recommends attending the registration event so students can pick up their iPad before the start of the school year. Those who cannot make the registration event will not receive their iPad until after the start of the school year.

All class schedules for Grades 6-12 will also be completed in time for the registration event. Parking passes for high school students will be available for purchase at the event (they cannot be purchased beforehand on the registration website).

## Healthcare Foundation of LaPorte Continues Support for NPUSC

New Prairie is pleased to announce that the Healthcare Foundation of La Porte has awarded the district with more than \$370,000.00 in funding for two separate grant projects. The district is grateful for the continued support and dedication of the Healthcare Foundation.

#### Partners in Prevention Grant

NPUSC will be participating in the Partners in Prevention grant program, an initiative that will help area schools identify, implement and sustain evidence-based substance use prevention programs. More than 17,500 La Porte County students will be served by curriculum that supports positive peer relationships and social competencies to avoid the use of addictive substances. New Prairie United School Corporation has been awarded \$244,635.00 for the next three years to implement these programs.

Empower Hour Afterschool Grant
