PSAT Student Results

Earlier this year, students in grades 9-11 completed the PSAT 8/9 or PSAT/NMSQT assessment. Scores were released to students through CollegeBoard.com earlier this month. This diagnostic exam has many benefits in identifying students for college scholarships as well as provide a predictive measurement for the Junior year SAT exam. NPHS staff has set a school goal on improving SAT scores for our Juniors, and we will be actively assisting students in understanding the assessment format, types and rigor of questions, and strategies useful for standardized testing.









21ST CENTURY SCHOLARS

Students identified as 21st Century Scholars met with the school counselors during the last week of November. Information was shared about the requirements to maintain the scholarship and the Scholar Track program. Attendance

Student attendance continues to be one of the biggest challenges that schools face today. When students are present in class, they have a better opportunity to learn new materials and master content with their teachers. It is also worth noting that student attendance rates must be above 90% in order to be approved for school-sponsored activities such as field trips and school dances.

We do understand at times that students are ill and need to stay home. We also encourage exercising healthy habits to maintain overall positive health. If you know that your student is going to be out, please contact the main office as soon as possible.

Scheduling Information

Scheduling for the 24–25 school year will begin in January. The Guidance Department will hold class meetings during Success Time after Winter Break to introduce the scheduling process to students in grades 9–11.

Students will then meet individually with their school counselor to review graduation requirements and select courses for next year. Student course selections will be entered in PowerSchool during the student's meeting. After the scheduling meeting, student course selection sheets will be emailed to students and parents for review. School Counselors can be contacted with any questions or concerns. The master schedule for the 24–25 school year will be created based on the student course requests.

The 24-25 Curriculum Guide link will be emailed and posted on the NPHS website in January. We encourage students to use careful thought when selecting courses for next year. Students choosing year-long courses are making a commitment for two semesters. Students will not be taken out of a year-long course at semester. We will do our best to schedule the requested courses; however, we **do not** honor specific teacher or lunch requests.

School counselors are always available throughout this process, please feel free to contact your student's assigned counselor with questions.






WINTER DRIVING

There is no need to preregister for a tutoring session.

A special schedule will be used to allow for sufficient time in the testing rooms with short breaks in between for additional studying/preparation. Odd period classes (1, 3, 5, and 7) will give finals on Thursday, December 21. Even period finals will be on Friday, December 22.

NAEP Testing Date

New Prairie High School was selected by National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) to administer both a reading and math exam for all 12th graders on February 1st.
