Wrestling Highlights

Individual State Champion and Team State Finals Appearance

The New Prairie Wrestling Team celebrated an extraordinary season with an impressive eighth place at

the IHSAA State Finals. Freshman MJ Staples led the charge, becoming the program's first freshman state champion with an unblemished 45-0 record. He was joined in state success by junior Jeffrey Huyvaert, who earned his third state medal (fifth place) and senior Devin Kendrex, who placed sixth in his fourth consecutive state appearance. Hayden Whitenack also qualified for the state tournament.

As a team, New Prairie posted a strong 19-4 record, went undefeated in the NIC and achieved a landmark victory over Penn. Their dominance was further evident by winning the sectional title and sending all 14 wrestlers to regionals. The team had nine wrestlers earn All-Conference NIC and six Academic All-State honorees. Individual sectional titles were earned by Michael Skaggs, Nate Scott, Caleb Halfacre, Jeffrey Huyvaert, Jayden Lewis, MJ Staples, Hayden Whitenack, Devin Kendrex and Lee Atherton.
