PSAT Testing Information

Students in Grades 9-11 will be participating in <u>PSAT Testing on Thursday, October 9th</u>. The standardized PSAT test is used by educators as a predictor for success on the SAT exam that students take in the Spring of their Junior year. At NPHS, we use these exams to help track student growth from the beginning of their Freshman year to the end of their Junior year. The results also inform the collaborative work of our teams to create a guaranteed and viable curriculum for all.

During the testing time on October 9th, Seniors will have options of completing a service learning opportunity, job shadow experience, or college visit. Students will be provided a form to document the outcomes of their choice. More information will be shared with Seniors through Schoology and in all-school announcements.

College Bound Cougars Activities in August

Last month kicked off our College Bound Cougars programming, where all students in Grades 9-12 learned about the college process, as well as other career options so that they will be prepared to make the best possible decisions for their futures when they graduate from NPHS. Topics in August included:

Grade 9

My Life's Work - Students discovered how they can live their life's work vs. just going to a job every day. They also heard from a member of the Indiana National Guard about job opportunities in the military.

AchieveWorks Skills Assessment - Students completed this assessment to ensure they are prepared for college and work-ready with a greater understanding of their skillset and ways to develop individual skills.

Grade 10

AchieveWorks Personality Assessment - Students completed this assessment to identify their personality type and see how it relates to post-secondary settings.

Grade 11

AchieveWorks Intelligences Assessment Students completed this assessment to help them
recognize their unique intellect, boost confidence
levels, strengthen both emotional and multiple
intelligences, and explore personalized career
recommendations.

Grade 12

Career Interest Profiler - The Career Interest Profiler is an online career interest assessment for students based on Holland's interest codes. When students completed the Career Interest Profiler, their results displayed their top Holland Code matches.

Types of Scholarships - Students learned about types of scholarships, reflected on how they will search, and made a plan for applying for scholarships.

National Scholarship Search - Students took part in a scholarship search demonstration to gather ideas on what scholarships might be right.

All Grades 9-12

Academic SMART Goal Setting - All students created a SMART (Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Relevant, Time-Bound) goal related to their academic success.

Extracurricular Activities - All students received information on all of the available extracurricular activities at NPHS and identified ones in which they are interested in participating.

My College Assessments - All students learned the basics of the major standardized tests (SAT, PSAT, AP) required by many colleges and important for earning college credits and scholarship opportunities.

My Test Prep Plan - All students learned about the various ways to prepare for standardized tests such as PSAT, SAT, AP, etc., and planned their preparation route. Students also explored the free test preparation tools for all of these exams available to them in Naviance.

New Prairie United School Corporation is heavily invested in the Professional Learning Communities at Work process. A critical part of this process includes staff being able to accurately assess a student's understanding of a learning target and determine next steps for continuous learning for each student.

Therefore, every Monday through Thursday, NPHS students have a 40-minute Success Time built into their day (9:45-10:25). This time allows for NPHS staff to meet the specific needs of our learners. By consistently monitoring student data, our staff are able to provide targeted remediation for struggling students as well as provide extension/enrichment activities for those who have already mastered the learning standard.

THESE ARE THE FACTS

TO PRACTICE Hard questions don't count any more than easy ones. If you see a really advanced equation, you can always skip it and come back to it later. Every question is worth the same amount of points, so just answer the easiest ones first.

You get 200 points for free!

Both the Math section and the English section are scored from 200 to 800. So, you start the SAT with 200 points in each section. In other words, you cannot score lower than 400.

Take a guess!

On the SAT, you do not lose points for an incorrect answer. This means that you should always guess instead of leaving an answer blank. If you guess on 8 multiple choice questions, the odds are that you will answer at least 2 of them correctly.

Have teachers told you not to "guess and check?" Well, on the SAT, you can guess and check all you want!
